2 Year Olds

What a wonderful term it has been in our two year old room, welcoming all our new children and families, and those returning. Our children have settled and adapted into nursery routine amazingly, building relationships with their teachers and peers, finding their interests and most importantly just having fun. We have fully embraced our core text this term, 'Shark in the Park' by Nick Sharratt; the children have really engaged with the story copying actions and reciting familiar phrases. Their favourite part to shout is "THERE'S A SHARK IN THE PARK!" It has been wonderful to watch the children interact with the story and to gain such enjoyment from it.

As our children have embraced nursery life, they have all demonstrated a huge interest in water play, finding ways in which it can be poured by using different resources, transporting it to different areas, pouring down tubes and pipes, watching and learning the cause and effect of how and where they pour it and how it travels.

We are very much looking forward to the next half-term ahead, embracing and exploring all things 'celebrations'!







3-4 Year Olds

It has been wonderful to see how quickly the children have settled back into the rhythm of school life. With the excitement of new routines, friendships, and engaging activities, this term is already shaping up to be an amazing start to the school year. This first half term has been all about helping everyone feel comfortable, supported, and ready to learn. Our children are adapting beautifully to new routines, and it is wonderful to see how quickly they are building confidence and independence. Morning greetings, circle time, and classroom rules are all helping to create a positive and welcoming environment where everyone feels they belong. One of the highlights of our learning so far has been our core text, *Shark in the Park on a Windy Day* by Nick Sharratt. This delightful story has captured the children's imaginations, sparking wonderful conversations and creativity in the classroom.

As the seasons begin to change, we have been taking time to enjoy the natural world around us. Autumn is a fantastic season to explore, and our children have loved watching the leaves change colour and observing the brisk changes in weather. These seasonal changes provide perfect opportunities for learning.
